WHEREAS, The Emerald Association of Long Island, Inc. has the distinction of being the charitable organization with the longest running annual fundraising ball of any society of its kind in the United States; and

WHEREAS, The first ball was held on February 7, 1839, at Smith's City Hotel in Brooklyn, and the event has been held at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel on Park Avenue since 1932, until this year which is being held at Battery Gardens; and

WHEREAS, It is the practice of this Legislative Body that when organizations of such noble aims and accomplishments are brought to our attention, they should be celebrated and recognized by all the citizens of this great Empire State; now, therefore, be it
