WHEREAS, OLMA is dedicated to providing a comprehensive education grounded in the charism of Catherine McAuley, foundress of the Sisters of Mercy; guided by the principles of Fides, Mores and Cultura, the faculty and staff educate young women within a compassionate environment to empower them to be authentic witnesses of Catholic values in the global community; and

WHEREAS, Ably led by Principal Joan Gordon, OLMA continues to prosper today and into the future; and
