The funding was secured through the Economic Development Program.

"The Cornell Cooperative Extension of Orange County continues to do great work providing our youth a variety of agriculture, nutrition, health, food safety, community, economic

vitality and agricultural sustainability educational programs," said Senator Bonacic "Once fully complete, the Education Center and 4-H park will provide students in the region a state-of-the-art educational facility. I'm pleased to provide this grant to help Cornell Cooperative Extension of Orange County."

Lucy Joyce, Executive Director of Cornell Cooperative Extension of Orange County said, "This grant was an unexpected gift, one that we are very grateful for, as it will allow us to complete phase I of our project. Construction on the Education Center and 4-H is taking place in 3 phases. Once completely finished, it will feature a year-round education center, environmental technology demonstration, open fenced arenas, six pole barns for livestock, a milking parlor, a big red barn, a greenhouse, a covered arena, and a camping area.
