Rochester, NY - In response to new recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Senator Samra Brouk urges New York State leadership to develop a plan to safely return students, teachers, and staff to in-person learning at schools in the 55th District and across the state.

Given the new CDC recommendations on reopening schools, I believe it is time to put plans in place for a safe return of our students, teachers, and staff, including equitable access to vaccinations for the adults who care for our children in schools," stated Senator Brouk.
