Senate Passes Legislation Prohibiting Harmful Levels of Toxics in Children's Jewelry

The New York State Senate yesterday passed a bill I sponsored that would prohibit the sale of children's jewelry which may contain harmful levels of cadmium and other hazardous substances. The bill (<u>S.4055A</u>) protects children from accidentally ingesting cadmium, often used in inexpensive charm bracelets, pendants and other jewelry.

Cadmium is a known carcinogen, which can hinder brain development in children and cause kidney, lung and intestinal damage. A 2009 report by the Associated Press (AP) found that Chinese manufacturers have been substituting cadmium for lead to make inexpensive jewelry which is then being sold by retailers in New York and other states. While lead is toxic to children at high exposure, cadmium has been linked to potential health issues at lower

exposures.

It is everyone's responsibility to protect our children, especially from products containing hazardous substances. This bill takes an important step to prevent the sale of items that could cause accidental and unnecessary exposure and severe health effects.
