Website poll allows area residents to share opinions

Albany, N.Y., January 13—As Governor Andrew Cuomo embarked on a statewide tour today to keep the public informed about many of the initiatives he outlined in his recent State of the State message, State Senator Tom O'Mara (R-C,Big Flats) is giving the residents of his 53rd Senate District an opportunity to share their own opinions online through www.omara.nysenate.gov.
