Flu Season is Here...

It's that time of year once again. Flu season is here. Even if you got your seasonal and/or the H1N1 flu shot last year, you need a flu shot this Fall. However, there are a couple of changes for this year from the Monroe County Health Department:

- This year's flu vaccine will contain H1N1 as it is believed H1N1 will circulate again. BUT, you will not need a separate shot.
- All persons **6 months and older** are encouraged to get vaccinated.
