Dear Senator Flanagan:

We write to urge the Senate to support the Governor's \$2.5 million appropriation with an additional \$1 million Senate-sponsored appropriation to fund Community Health Advocates (CHA).

Designated in 2010 as New York's statewide health consumer assistance program, CHAs help more than 40,000 individuals and small businesses annually with Marketplace, private and public health insurance coverage, helping them to understand and use their coverage. Since 2010, CHAs have assisted over 300,000 New Yorkers and saved approximately \$26 million for New Yorkers in health insurance and health care costs.

The continuing threat of major changes to the health system make the need for CHAs all the more pressing. Our constituents are fearful and confused about these changes and need help navigating and accessing the future healthcare system. CHAs are perfectly positioned to help our constituents. They provide services through a central live-answer, toll-free helpline and network of 25 community-based organizations and small businesses serving groups, operating in all 62 counties of the state. The Community Service Society, in cooperation with three specialist agencies – Empire Justice Center, The Legal Aid Society, and Medicare Rights Center – supports the CHA network by providing technical support, comprehensive training and backup for complex cases.

CHA's helpline, which is listed on all commercial insurance carriers' Explanations of Benefits and claim denials, serves approximately 10,000 callers per year and handles complex commercial insurance coverage appeals of denials of care and payment of medical bills. The CHA network is there to help people with job-based or other forms of private and public coverage. CHAs help consumers understand how to use their insurance; resolve billing issues and coverage denials; maximize their coverage (by securing prior authorizations, access to specialists, and assistance with out-of-network and surprise bills); find affordable health care and patient/pharmacy assistance, and access hospital financial assistance programs.

The CHA program has also been lauded nationally as the leading model of a consumer assistance program by the Kaiser Family Foundation, the National Governor's Association, Families USA, and the Unites States Department of Health and Human Services.

At its height, CHAs were funded with \$7 million (federal grants under ACA) and provided services through 27 community-based organizations and 34 small business servings group. In 2015, federal funding for consumer assistance programs ended. Since then, CHAs have been funded by the Executive and Assembly, with the Governor providing \$2.5 million and the Assembly providing \$1 million (2017-18 State Budget).

To ensure that the CHA network is there to assist our constituents as they face fear and uncertainty, we respectfully ask for the Senate to provide \$1 million to CHAs in addition to the Executive's \$2.5 million in the 2018-19 State Budget.


