WOODCOCK SUBJECT TO CHANGE IN FEDERAL REGULATIONS

Important Notice!

If you hunt migratory birds, including woodcock, you must register each year with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service under the Harvest Information Program (HIP). By calling a toll-free number and giving your name, address and date of birth, you will be given a number which must be recorded on your hunting license.

Waterfowlers must register in addition to purchasing federal duck stamps, and you must re-register each year. The program is intended to improve harvest reports of migratory game so that the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has a better understanding of populations when it sets annual hunting regulations.

Determining Future Dates

NORTHERN ZONE

Archery Season

Deer and Bear: September 27 through the Friday immediately preceding the next to the last Saturday in October. (Sept. 27-Oct. 22, 2011; only unfilled prior year big game tags can be used before October I)

- SOUTHERN
- ZONE

Archery Season

Deer and Bear: The Saturday following the second Monday in October (Columbus Day) through the day prior to the opening of the regular Southern Zone deer season, and 9 days immediately following the close of the regular deer season. (Oct. I6-Nov. 19, 2011 and Dec. 13-21, 2011)

Regular Season

Deer and Bear: The next to the last Saturday in October through the first Sunday in December. (Oct. 23-Dec. 5, 2011)

Regular Season

Deer: 23 days beginning the third Saturday of November. (Nov. 20-Dec. 12, 2011) Bear/Catskills: 23 days beginning the third Saturday in November. (Nov. 20-Dec. 12, 2011) Bear/Allegany: The first Saturday after the opening of the regular deer season through the end of the regular deer season. (Nov. 27-Dec. 12, 2011)

Muzzleloading Season

Deer and Bear: The seven day period ending on the day before the regular season begins. (Oct. I6-Oct. 22, 2011)

Muzzleloading Season

Deer and Bear: The 9 days immediately following the close of the regular deer season. (Dec. 13-21, 2011)

Early Bear Season

The first Saturday after the second Monday in September through the day immediately preceding the opening of the muzzleloading season. (Sept. 18-Oct. 15, 2011)

Westchester County Regular Season

Deer: The Saturday following the second Monday in October (Columbus Day) and continuing through December 31st. (Oct. 16-Dec. 31, 2011)
