INFORMATION ON NATIONAL "DO NOT CALL" REGISTRY

Since taking effect in 2001, the "Do Not Call" Registry has become one of the most effective and popular consumer laws in New York State. In 2003, New York State merged its registry with the National "Do Not Call" Registry to provide the most comprehensive protection available. As the prime sponsor of the original "Do Not Call" bill, I understand the desire of individuals to prevent unwanted phone calls by telemarketers by registering their phone numbers on the National "Do Not Call" Registry. To register your phone number, I encourage you to visit www.donotcall.gov, or call (888) 382-1222. Registration is free and valid for five years.
