## **Badge of Honor Association's Fallen Officer Dedication**



On Tuesday, I had the distinct privilege of attending the Badge of Honor Association's (BOHA) Fallen Officer sign dedication ceremony. The BOHA, in conjunction with the Rochester Police Department, held the ceremony to honor the fallen heroes from the road and jail bureaus of the Monroe County Sheriff's Office (http://www.monroecounty.gov/sheriff-index.php).

At Tuesday's ceremony, the memorial plaque for Sergeant Robert Skelton Jr. (http://www.odmp.org/officer/12320-sergeant-robert-m-whitey-skelton-jr) was unveiled at the intersection of Clover Street and Tobey Road in Pittsford. Sgt. Skelton was killed in the line of duty in 1973 when an intoxicated driver crossed into Sgt. Skelton's lane, causing a collision. The memorial plaque for Sgt. Skelton was the first of eight signs that are to be erected throughout Monroe County for the eight fallen deputies in the Monroe County Sheriff's Department's storied history. Each plaque will depict the officer's name, rank, badge number and date they died – known as their End of Watch (E.O.W.)

The Badge of Honor Association was established in 2007 by Rochester Police Officers to honor the brave individuals who made the ultimate sacrifice while protecting and serving the citizens of Monroe County.
