WHEREAS, Frederick Lowell Whipple's commitment to excellence, and his spirit of humanity, carried over into all fields of enterprise, including charitable and civic endeavors; and

WHEREAS, Frederick Lowell Whipple is survived by his beloved wife, Loretta, brother, Thomas, and sisters, Constance and Violet; and

WHEREAS, Armed with a humanistic spirit and imbued with a sense of compassion, Frederick Lowell Whipple leaves behind a legacy which will long endure the passage of time and will remain as a comforting memory to all he served and befriended; now, therefore, be it
