WHEREAS, A further testament to her dedication to accessible therapy, Mary T. Kuhn worked for Contact Community Services as an on-air therapist for the radio show entitled Teen Talk; and

WHEREAS, Since retirement, Mary T. Kuhn has been involved in the CNY Interfaith Sanctuary Coalition which seeks to educate various faith communities about the injustice of the immigration system and to advocate for and support those individuals caught in it; and

WHEREAS, Mary T. Kuhn is the co-founder of Onondaga Votes!, a non-partisan group focused on voter registration and civic engagement; she is also on the Board of ArtRage, a gallery in the Hawley Green neighborhood of Syracuse which exhibits progressive art supporting social justice and encouraging social change; and

WHEREAS, It is the sense of this Legislative Body that when individuals of such noble aims and accomplishments are brought to our attention, they should be celebrated and recognized by all the citizens of the great State of New York; now, therefore, be it
