WHEREAS, In 1946, Robert B. Thomas and the former Doris E. Jones were united in marriage and together the couple had two daughters, Symra and Sandra, along with his other children, Robert Pridgeon and Terri Glover; and

WHEREAS, Robert B. Thomas worked in construction with Local 60, Engineer Union 137, Local 15, and Con Edison to put his daughters through college; and

WHEREAS, Furthermore, he later worked as a foreman and is proud of his work helping to construct the Tappan Zee Bridge, which provided him with the experience to help build the Throgs Neck Bridge and the second deck of the George Washington Bridge; and

WHEREAS, Today, Robert B. Thomas has four grandchildren, Duane Nichols, Nicole Colon, Turhan Brandon, and Tanya Brandon, as well as nine great-grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, Robert B. Thomas is known by his family and his community as a generous, giving person who has helped many children with their education and goals; and
