period in Harlem, New York, Alice Mae Springer and her family moved to Brooklyn; and

WHEREAS, During her time in Harlem, Alice Mae Springer held a variety of jobs, including crafting sequins, styling hair, making sweet potato turnovers, and caring for the children in the neighborhood, all of which contributed to her repertoire of skills and abilities; and

WHEREAS, In 1957, Alice Mae Springer married her beloved husband, Robert Lark Menden Goodson; the couple later moved to Franklin Avenue in Brooklyn in 1974, the cherished home where they raised their children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, Alice Mae Springer Goodson was very active in her church community, Washington Temple Church of God in Christ, where she served as the "Mother" of the junior church, before being asked to serve as the "Mother" of the whole church, an esteemed role of honor which she faithfully and dedicatedly fulfills; and

WHEREAS, Alice Mae Springer Goodson, with her zest for life, has inspired and enhanced the lives of her family and friends; and

WHEREAS, With her throughout have been her six children, Shirley, Aaron, Theresa, Ricky, Lisa, and Renita, all of whom feel privileged to be a part of her life and rejoice in her many achievements; and

WHEREAS, This exceptional centenarian has experienced the incredible joys and sorrows characteristic of and reserved for those with the stamina and courage to savor a full life; and
