WHEREAS, James Maxwell enjoyed spending time on Lake Mahopac with his family after he moved to Mahopac in 1970; he loved boating, was an avid New York Yankees fan, and had a passion for local politics; and

WHEREAS, James Maxwell distinguished himself in his profession and by his sincere dedication and substantial contribution to the welfare of his community; and

WHEREAS, James Maxwell's commitment to excellence, and his spirit of humanity, carried over into all fields of enterprise, including charitable and civic endeavors; and

WHEREAS, James Maxwell is survived by his wife, Josephine Cestaro; his children, Col. James Maxwell, Alayne Melanophy, Joseph Maxwell, and John Maxwell; his grandchildren, Connor, Kelly, Ryan, Kristen, Jack, Casey, Jamie, Joseph, and Daniel; he was predeceased by his brother William and sister, Kathleen Sky; and
