CONGRATULATING the Rye High School Boys Varsity  
Football Team for winning the New York State Class B  
Championship

WHEREAS, The fabled tradition of gridiron success at Rye High School has continued with the Rye Boys Varsity Football Team's victory in the New York State Class B Championship game topping defending champion Maine-Endwell 28-7 at the Carrier Dome in Syracuse, NY on October 3, 2023, capturing the program's fourth state title in its history and its first since 2008; and

WHEREAS, The achievement follows the building of one of the most solid and consistent high school programs in the state, finishing the regular season winning four straight games with a 6-2 record, outscoring opponents 152 to 40, and amassing a staggering 1,507 yards of total offense through an explosive offense and a stingy defense throughout the season; and

WHEREAS, This championship season was made possible with the Garnet combination of explosive offense, big play defense, and physical strength at the line that powered point production and shutting down opponents, strategic muscle that was apparent regardless of the size of opposing teams; and

WHEREAS, The 2023 Garnets used these strengths, play execution, and

great game strategy to move through the successive rounds of sectional and state playoff tournament competition against worthy opponents; sectional victories began with an impressive 33-18 victory against Nyack, which was followed by a 41-13 victory over the Ardsley Panthers, and later, a Section 1 Class B Final against Pleasantville with a convincing win of 35-21; and

WHEREAS, Rye's tremendous offense continued to shine in the State Regional Final against Section 9 champion Port Jervise with a victory of 28-14; this was followed by the Class B State Semifinal playoff win over Section 2 champion Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk with a score of 24-10 to clinch their spot in the state championship; and

WHEREAS, The team, finishing the season with an outstanding record of 12-2, including winning their last 10 consecutive games, were loyally and enthusiastically supported by family, fans, friends, and the community at large, all treated to the contact, sights, and sounds of high school football at the highest level; and
