distinguished citizen and devoted member of his

WHEREAS, Ronald Shafran of Bayside, New York, died on April 21,  
2024, at the age of 77; and

WHEREAS, Born on March 15, 1947, Ronald Shafran was raised in  
Flushing, Queens; earning the title of National Merit Scholar, he  
graduated with Honors from Queens College and obtained both his  
bachelor's and master's degrees; and

WHEREAS, Embarking on his career, Ronald Shafran began as a teacher  
at Adlai Stevenson High School and earned the respect of his peers as  
the youngest Department Head in the school's history; he also  
established himself as an accomplished author of educational textbooks;  
and

WHEREAS, Getting involved in government and politics, Ronald Shafran  
worked to help elect President Jimmy Carter before serving as a Deputy

Commissioner in the Koch Administration; in the private sector, he became an award-winning advertising executive and government relations consultant for 30 years before his retirement; and

WHEREAS, Serving as a mentor to his son and involving himself in the community, Ronald Shafran coached Little League and attended all his baseball games; together, they enjoyed attending New York Yankees games; and

WHEREAS, Ronald Shafran distinguished himself in his profession and by his sincere dedication and substantial contribution to the welfare of his community; and

WHEREAS, Ronald Shafran's commitment to excellence, and his altruistic nature, carried over into all fields of enterprise, including charitable and civic endeavors; and

WHEREAS, Ronald Shafran is survived by his wife of 50 years, Phyllis; his son, Austin; his grandsons, Mason and Teddy; his sister, Denise; and his daughter-in-law, Jennifer; and

WHEREAS, Armed with a humanistic spirit and imbued with a sense of compassion, Ronald Shafran leaves behind a legacy which will long endure the passage of time and will remain as a comforting memory to all he served and befriended; now, therefore, be it
