Rangel's hard work resulted in the construction of the Alma Rangel Gardens, an 89-unit apartment building which provides housing and support services for Harlem's senior citizens who have low or moderate income; and

WHEREAS, Alma E. Rangel was a longtime activist with sincere commitment to her family, her community, and the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, Revered as an elegant, genuinely caring, dedicated, and supportive advocate of exemplary integrity, Alma E. Rangel was a true and cherished friend to so many who loved her in return, and she will be greatly missed and lovingly remembered as an inspiration to many; and

WHEREAS, Alma E. Rangel is survived by her beloved husband, retired Congressman, Charles B. Rangel; her son, Steven; and her daughter, Alicia; and

WHEREAS, Armed with a humanistic spirit and imbued with a sense of compassion, Alma E. Rangel leaves behind a legacy which will long endure the passage of time and will remain as a comforting memory to all she served and befriended; now, therefore, be it
