WHEREAS, His professional life, including terms as Assessor and Assistant Building Inspector for the Village of Croton-on-Hudson, was distinguished by professionalism and consideration; and

WHEREAS, Anthony John Gagliotti's vibrant spirit, love for people, and community involvement made him a beloved figure, leaving a legacy of service and earning him the Key to the Village of Croton-on-Hudson and the honor of leading the 2024 Summerfest parade as its Grand Marshal; and

WHEREAS, Anthony John Gagliotti's legacy of compassion and service merits the grateful tribute of this Legislative Body; now, therefore, be it
