

Senate Republicans Announce "Liberate New York" 2025 Legislative Agenda

Albany, NY - Yesterday the New York State Senate Republican Conference unveiled "Liberate New York," a comprehensive legislative agenda of policy goals for 2025 to combat the Democrat establishment in New York State.
