Honoree Samantha Rosado-Ciriello said: "I am incredibly honored to be recognized by the Majority Leader. She is an incredible person, and I'm inspired by her every day. It was an honor to be there among all the other courageous women honorees from across the state. It was very powerful to hear their stories and journeys, and it was inspiring to be in a space where women are celebrating and lifting each other up. But this recognition isn't mine. scholarships, and internships to build a diverse educator workforce.
