Feroletto was born on August 4, 1953, to John and Antoinette "Toni" Feroletto and grew up on Buffalo's West Side; he attended Buffalo Public School No. 1 and continued on to become the first member of his family to graduate from college, as well as the first to earn a law degree from the University at Buffalo School of Law; and

WHEREAS, While attending law school, John A. Feroletto met the love of his life, Paula, and they both graduated in 1982; together, they raised three children, John, Joel, and Kate, providing them with a life filled with love, guidance, and support; and

WHEREAS, In 1993, John A. Feroletto started his own law firm, Feroletto Law; a highly respected law firm that has been representing

victims of accidents and injuries for the past 30 years, he was very proud of the fact that, at one time, he and all three of his children worked at Feroletto Law; and

Feroletto had a distinguished career as a trial lawyer, known as a steadfast advocate for the rights of individuals; his unwavering commitment to justice and exceptional skill in the courtroom earned him numerous accolades, including the prestigious NYSTLA Trial Lawyer of the Year Award; treating his clients like family, he developed lifelong relationships through his practice; and

WHEREAS, John A. Feroletto's love for nature extended to his cherished home in Thunder Bay, Canada, where he and his wife, Paula, spent countless joyous summers, especially in recent years, with their grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, Among all of his passions and interests, John A. Feroletto's greatest love was his family; a devoted husband of 45 years to Paula and a proud father of three, his grandchildren were the light of his life, and he reveled in spending time with them; John and Paula Feroletto opened their home to many nieces, nephews, and most recently, Khin Khin Htike; and
