A special education teacher in the Buffalo Public School system, Courtney and her family have been tireless advocates, raising awareness about apraxia and available treatments.

Senator Baskin noted, "Courtney and all of the Malicki's speak to people across our state and even in Canada about how they can be of help to loved ones with apraxia. Through their determination, they are lending a helping hand to other individuals locally and beyond. I am so pleased that May has been designated Apraxia Awareness Month.
