(White Plains, NY) - In recognition of Sexual Assault Awareness Month, State Senator Shelley B. Mayer partnered with Pace Women's Justice Center to host a toiletry drive throughout Senate District 37. In total, over 2,000 toiletry items were collected and donated to YWCA Women's Residence and Clinical Services.

Individuals dropped their donations at one of the drop-off locations: Elisabeth Haub School of Law at Pace University, Yonkers Will Library, Pound Ridge Town House, Tuckahoe Village Hall and Senator Mayer's White Plains District office. Donors provided hygiene products such as shampoo, conditioner, toothpaste, toothbrushes, body wash, moisturizer, deodorant, and feminine hygiene products.

Senator Shelley Mayer said, "I am truly grateful for the generosity of so many throughout my district who donated supplies to support survivors of sexual assault and domestic violence. Everyone deserves access to these essential items. While many of us purchase these items without a second thought, that is unfortunately not the reality for everyone.
