Eleanor Kwei began her distinguished career in illustration after graduating from the Academy of Art University in San Francisco. Over the years, she has contributed to iconic literary properties such as *Winnie the Pooh* and authored five books on art.

Beyond her professional accomplishments, Eleanor is deeply involved in fostering the arts locally through the Croton River Artisans Gallery and her support of the Croton-on-Hudson Arts and Humanities Advisory Council.

A passionate environmental advocate, Eleanor also lends her energy to local sustainability efforts, including organic community gardens and Croton100, a community group focused on climate action and environmental responsibility.
