


Senator Steve Rhoads' 3rd Annual Freedom Food Drive Collects Over 800 Pounds of Food for Local Families in Need

Bethpage, NY — Ahead of Independence Day, Senator Steve Rhoads brought the community together for his 3rd Annual Freedom Food Drive, collecting over 800 pounds of food to benefit the Food Pantry at Our Lady of Mercy in Hicksville. The event was held on Saturday, June 28, outside the ShopRite on Hempstead Turnpike and drew dozens of volunteers, including local Scout troops, civic groups, and generous residents.

"This event is about more than just food—it's about freedom, community, and compassion," said Senator Steve Rhoads. "As we celebrate our independence, we also recognize the importance of looking out for one another. I'm incredibly proud of our community for showing up, giving back, and helping ensure no family goes hungry this summer."

The food drive was hosted in partnership with **Island Harvest**, one of Long Island's largest hunger-relief organizations, which helped coordinate the donation logistics.
