WHEREAS, This auspicious occasion will be celebrated with a community-wide event at the Holding Point in Horseheads, New York, on Saturday, May 30, 2009; in addition, an awards ceremony will take place with musical guest FLAME, an internationally acclaimed band featuring individuals with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, Serving the needs of persons with disabilities residing in both Steuben County and Chemung County for the past 30 years, AIM Independent Living Center is a human service agency with offices located in Bath, Corning, Elmira and Hornell; and

WHEREAS, AIM is part of a national network of organizations called Independent Living Centers (ILC) which is a nonresidential resource center run by and for people with a personal knowledge of disabilities; and

WHEREAS, Furthermore, ILC are resource centers for people with disabilities who want to increase their independence; AIM's core services include Information and Referrals, Peer Counseling, Independent Living Skills, and Community and Individual Advocacy; and
