include truck hijackings, major thefts, terrorism cases, and crimes against children; extremely diligent, he was responsible for an undercover assignment which resulted in 47 arrests and 47 convictions; and WHEREAS, It is the sense of this Legislative Body that those dedicated public servants who unselfishly devote their lives to the preservation of order and the protection of others are worthy and due full praise for their commitment and noble endeavors; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED, That this Legislative Body pause in its deliberations to honor Steven E.
