WHEREAS, In addition, Dora Fowler obtained her Master of Education degree from SUNY Oneonta on May 30, 1970, and received the prestigious honor of being designated the Teacher of the Year in 2001 by Walmart;

WHEREAS, During her esteemed tenure with Roxbury Central School, Dora Fowler has taught on both the elementary and secondary levels; today, she teaches remedial grammar and writing to fifth and sixth graders and provides help when needed with middle level English language art classes; and

WHEREAS, Educators like Dora Fowler provide a tremendous service to the future of our state and nation, inspiring generations of young people in their educational journeys and ensuring their success in their future years; and

WHEREAS, Throughout her distinguished career, Dora Fowler has continually demonstrated an impressive dedication, an unparalleled devotion and an unremitting enthusiasm for the quality of the educational programs and opportunities offered at Roxbury Central School for the benefit of its faculty and students, as well as for the entire community; and
