WHEREAS, She went on to earn a master's degree in education from Brooklyn College in 1987, and in 1991, an Advanced Certificate in Administration and Supervision; and

WHEREAS, Enthusiastic about working with children, Mary Allen Bosco became a New York City Department of Education teacher in September 1984, beginning her teaching career in the school where she is now the

Principal, the Elizabeth Leary School, P.S. 207; she taught First Grade for eight years and Fifth Grade for three years before becoming the Assistant Principal in 1995; and

WHEREAS, Mary Allen Bosco has been the Principal of P.S. 207 in Marine Park, Brooklyn since 1997; she has transformed the previous elementary school into an exemplary Pre-Kindergarten to Grade 8 Public School; comprised of two buildings and 1180 students, the school has truly flourished under her leadership; and

WHEREAS, With Mary Allen Bosco throughout have been her husband of more than 20 years, Salvatore Bosco, and their children, Lauren and James, all of whom are proud to be part of her life and rejoice in her many achievements; and
