is an exotic fusion of Jamaican musical forms of reggae, ska, and folk

with jazz and r & b wrapped around verses of social consciousness and personal struggle; his reflective rhymes and frenzied performance style have been featured at the Brooklyn Academy of Music and Nuyoricans Poets Cafe in New York City; and

WHEREAS, Wayne Chambers has also served as the opening act for such international renowned artists as Jamaican dub poet Oku Onoura, British Grammy Award nominee Linton Kwesi Johnson, and late South African reggae sensation Lucky Dube; and
