WHEREAS, Jacki Foster worked at P.S. 44 for three years before being appointed as a Math teacher at Clara Barton High School, where she worked for the next 25 years; and

WHEREAS, In 2007, Jacki Foster became a Mentor for Supervisors in the Supervisory Support Program, a collaboration between the New York City Department of Education and the Council of School Supervisors and Administrators; and

WHEREAS, A graduate of Seward Park High School, Jacki Foster later attended Baruch College of the City University of New York; after getting married and moving to Brooklyn, she left school only to return five years later and graduated from Brooklyn College; and WHEREAS, It is the sense of this Legislative Body to commend the efforts of those individuals who work to support our proud tradition of public education by providing their skills and talents to our schools; now, therefore, be it
