WHEREAS, At an early age, Linda Cockfield showed a passion for chil-

dren, spending most of her youth teaching Sunday School; and WHEREAS, It was while teaching Sunday School that Linda Cockfield met her future husband, Simon Cockfield; the two of them grew up together teaching Sunday School; they both knew from their youth that the Lord meant for them to be together; and WHEREAS, Linda Cockfield was educated at Peters Hall School, also known as St. Theresa's Anglican school; and WHEREAS, After completion of her primary education, Linda Cockfield went on to attend Carnegie School of Home Economics; and WHEREAS, Linda Cockfield worked with the Guyanese government as a Dispensary Assistant at the Government Pharmacy in Georgetown where she handled in and outpatient dispensary from 1969-1978, when Linda and her family moved to the United States; and WHEREAS, Linda Cockfield has been called upon to contribute her time and talents to countless civic and charitable endeavors and has always given of herself unstintingly; and WHEREAS, In America, Linda Cockfield continued to serve the Lord and pursue her passion to work with children in God's Battalion of Prayer Church, headed by her Brother-in-Law, Bishop Alfred Cockfield; and WHEREAS, Years later, Linda Cockfield and her husband converted their garage into a Bible School for children all over the Rockaways; the class was taught every Thursday afternoon; and WHEREAS, This endeavor helped plant the seed for the Battalion Pentecostal Assembly Church, Inc., which held its first Sunday service in 1986, and has continued to grow every year since; and WHEREAS, Throughout the entire period of her community service, a period of constructive involvement, Linda Cockfield has stood constant in dignity, good grace and humor; and
