WHEREAS, Guy Joseph Pasquale of Binghamton, New York, died on June 4, 2012, at the age of 95; and

WHEREAS, Guy Joseph Pasquale was born at his parents' home in Binghamton, New York, into a large family headed by Antonio and Annadomenica Pasquale, who immigrated to the United States from La Fara Filiorum Petra in the Abruzzo, Italy; and

WHEREAS, Guy Pasquale honorably served his country in World War II as a member of the Eighth Air Force when he was stationed in both England and the Pacific; and

WHEREAS, Guy Pasquale distinguished himself in his profession and by his sincere dedication and substantial contribution to the welfare of his community; and

WHEREAS, Home and work were the centers of Guy Pasquale's life; he worked in the family construction business and then began his career in the beverage business as a partner in Mission Beverage/Canada Dry; and WHEREAS, Affectionately known as the unofficial Mayor of Broad Avenue, Guy Pasquale was the warehouse manager at Mincolla Distributing into his nineties; and

WHEREAS, As a nonagenarian, Guy Pasquale was driving his car to work as a daily volunteer at Team World; and

WHEREAS, Guy Pasquale's passion for the New York Mets was legendary; he lived a rich and rewarding life and took pleasure in the successes of his family and friends; and

WHEREAS, Guy Pasquale was a lifelong member of St. Mary of the Assumption Church; and

WHEREAS, Guy Pasquale's commitment to excellence, and his spirit of humanity, carried over into all fields of enterprise, including charita-

ble and civic endeavors; and

WHEREAS, In recognition of his accomplishments and his love of his hometown, January 25, 2012, was officially declared Guy J.
