WHEREAS, Warren County is known for its natural history and agricultural heritage, and for the beauty of the Adirondack Park, as well as its many rivers, lakes, and forests, which draw visitors and tourists to the fresh mountain air for boating, camping, hiking, and summering; and WHEREAS, Remaining fruitful over the ebb and flow of decades of growth and change, Warren County continues its commitment to enhancing the quality of life of its citizens, ensuring a positive business, institutional and educational climate, and providing all essential services; now, therefore, be it
