WHEREAS, Attendant to such concern, and in full accord with its long-standing traditions, this Legislative Body is justly proud to congratulate Gabriella Selbe, Maymunah Sarujamohaden, Ejaniia Clayton and Cheyenne Alvarez of Albany Leadership Charter High School for Girls, upon the occasion of their First Place win in the Capital Region History Day Contest; and

WHEREAS, The Capital Region History Day Contest was held on Saturday, March 23, 2013, at the Cultural Education Center in Albany, New York; the preliminary regional competition of the National History Day Contest, the Capital Region event attracted 132 students and 75 entries from schools in Albany, Clifton Park, Delmar, Guilderland, Granville, Troy, and Schenectady; and

WHEREAS, National History Day is a year-long academic program focused on historical research for 6th to 12th grade students; and

WHEREAS, National History Day makes history come alive for America's youth by engaging them in the discovery of the historic, cultural and social experiences of the past; through hands-on experiences and presentations, today's students are better able to inform the present and shape the future; National History Day transforms the process of learning history through utilizing project-based curriculum and instruction

and the spirit of competition; and

WHEREAS, In New York State, National History Day is sponsored by the New York State Historical Association which encourages students to explore local, state, national, and world history; after selecting a historical topic that relates to an annual theme, students conduct extensive research by using libraries, archives, museums, and oral history interviews; and

WHEREAS, As part of National History Day, New York students analyze and interpret their findings, draw conclusions about their topics' significance in history, and create final projects that illustrate their work; this year's theme was "Turning Points in History"; and

WHEREAS, Gabriella Selbe, Maymunah Sarujamohaden, Ejaniia Clayton and Cheyenne Alvarez are 10th grade honor students at Albany Leadership Charter High School for Girls; coached by their teacher, Emma Steckman, these scholars won First Place in the Senior Group Performance category for their project, "The Sounds of the French Revolution"; and

WHEREAS, By capturing First Place in their division at the Capital Region History Day Contest, Gabriella Selbe, Maymunah Sarujamohaden, Ejaniia Clayton and Cheyenne Alvarez of Albany Leadership Charter High School for Girls, qualified to advance to the state competition held in Cooperstown, New York, on April 29, 2013; and

WHEREAS, It is appropriate to celebrate the accomplishments of remarkable and exceptional students who participate in these educational contests and who have achieved noteworthy recognition for their efforts; and
