Senator Johnson Congratulates Babylon Memorial Grade School

State Senator Owen H. Johnson (4th Senate District, Babylon) recently paid a visit to the Babylon Memorial Grade School where he presented the school with a New York State Legislative Resolution commending the school on being named a 2008 National School of Character by the Character Education Partnership. The Babylon Memorial Grade School began its character program six years ago. Since that time, the school has experienced improved academic scores as well as decreased absenteeism

and discipline problems.

"And it is clear that the entire Babylon Memorial Grade School community recognizes this and has gone above and beyond to ensure that they are instilling a sense of character in their students at every opportunity. What the community has done here is create a model that can be emulated by other schools and that is an amazing achievement."
