Copiague Honor Is Music To Senator Johnson's Ears

"I am just delighted that Copiague has been chosen as one of the 100 best communities for music education. It's something of which the school district -- and everyone who is involved with the music program here at Copiague -- should be very proud."

Senator Johnson presented Superintendent William Bolton and the School District with a New York State Legislative Resolution honoring the district on securing this designation at a recent legislative breakfast at the Walter O'Connell High School.
