SYRACUSE, N.Y.--Senator David J. Valesky and Senate President Malcolm A. Smith toured the 2009 Upstate Latino Summit where they met with various leaders of the community and discussed vital issues to ongoing Latino success and empowerment in New York.

The Spanish Action League of Onondaga County Inc. has been serving the needs of Hispanics in Onondaga County since its creation over 40 years ago. Over the past four decades they have provided a diverse array of services to members of their community such as: career services; domestic violence assistance; family support services; housing assistance; language services and youth leadership and development services.

"I am very pleased that Syracuse served as host city for The Upstate Latino Summit this year," said Senator David J. Valesky. "Central New York's rich cultural diversity is a real strength for the region and it is something we must remember as we work to improve education, expand health coverage and create jobs."
