Recently, Governor Paterson announced after a private meeting with the Democratic leaders of the Senate and the Assembly that the repeal of sales tax increases on clothing was "on the table". This latest tax increase would remove the ability of our residents to purchase clothing items under \$110 without paying state sales tax which has been the law since initiated under the Republican majority in the Senate to help everyone afford the necessities their family needs.

Governor David Paterson, Senate Majority Leader John Sampson and Assembly Speaker Sheldon Silver are discussing this idea behind closed doors without any public input and that is the wrong approach.
