Governor Paterson Signs Four MWBE Bills into Law

Governor David A. Paterson signed four ground-breaking bills into law, including legislation the establish a level playing field for Minority and Women-Owned Business Enterprises (MWBEs) if York State. Three of the bills were Governor's Program Bills.

"With these pieces of legislation, our State is building on its proud history of opening the door success for any New Yorker who has the talent, drive and passion for their business to success Governor Paterson said. "But there is still much work to be done to correct disparities in governor contracting. By improving equity in the State procurement process and facilitating greater ac Minority and Women-Owned Business Enterprises, we help businesses thrive, and we will help recover from recession."

Senator Ruth Hassell-Thompson said: "These bills intend to bring our State procurement processes the 21st Century by removing barriers that have historically prevented women and persons of from reaching full economic parity with respect to contracting opportunities in this State. By the 2040 more than 50% of the population of New York State will be made up of what are termed groups." New York State has lagged behind even the private secons respect to its contract expenditures for Minority and Women's Business Enterprises (MWBEs). bill package, also known as the New York State Business Diversity Act ensures that the State's controlled entities, public authorities and agencies have developed and codified a strategy air inclusion and meaningful participation of MWBEs across New York State. In June 2008, Governor Paterson issued Executive Order No. 10, which established the Task F Minority and Women Business Enterprises. As a result of the Executive Order and the work of Force, MWBE participation quadrupled. The firms that are involved with investment banking a issuance of debt went from 4.2 percent MWBE in 2007 to 23.9 percent now. Under Governor I leadership, minority and women firms have yielded an increase of \$162 million in revenue from year levels. With regard to transportation, thirteen percent of stimulus transportation projects gone to Disadvantaged Business Enterprises – for a total of \$146 million dollars and an estimation of the projects of the project

The following MWBE bills were signed into law:

Governor's Program Bill No. 297 (S.8312/ A.11525): Raises the cap on discretionary put that a State agency can award to MWBEs or small businesses from \$100,000 to \$200,000, su the agency's internal controls, but not based on full-blown competitive procurement procedure.

Governor's Program Bill No. 298 (S.8313/ A.11526): Expands contracting practices of pauthorities granting increased opportunities for MWBE participation. Additionally, requires the procurement guidelines for each State public authority include the designation of one or more staff to eversee the authority's MWBE program and requires that procurements be conducted.
