

Senator John Flanagan (2nd Senate District) recently visited the entire 5th grade class at the New Lane Elementary School in Selden to discuss the New York State Senate with the students. Senator Flanagan spoke to the students after being invited by some of their classmates who took part in a Veteran's Day celebration at the Long Island State Veterans Home in Stony Brook.

During his visit to the school, Senator Flanagan discussed his role in the legislative process, his efforts to protect the residents of the 2nd Senate District and other topics that provided

the students with an overview of how New York State government operates.
