The Intel Science Talent Search is the nation's most prestigious pre-college science competition. Participants come from all across the country, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands to compete in the program. Joshua was one of only 300 students nationwide selected as semi-finalists.

In addition to being named an Intel semifinalist, Joshua is also a National Merit Scholar and is a member of the National, Science, Math, Spanish, and Music Honor Societies. Joshua is also an officer in the school's Science Club, a member of the math team, and plays tenor saxophone in the school band. Joshua plans to study biomedical engineering in college next fall.
