State Senator Hugh T. Farley (R, C, I - Schenectady) has joined with the Adelphi NY Statewide Breast Cancer Hotline and Support Program in its annual Mother's Day campaign to urge women to get mammograms.

"Mother's Day is a significant time to remind women to get mammograms," said Senator Farley. "I hope that this Mother's Day women will take the time to make an appointment for a mammogram. Some 95 percent of all mammograms prove to be normal."
