Currently there are 114,000 children in the U.S. waiting for adoptive homes.

The senator continued, "There is nothing more powerful to a foster child than to be welcomed in one's home after temporarily, or even permanently, losing everything. Fostering a child is a rewarding experience for everyone involved and I hope, if possible, anyone

capable of opening their heart and home will do so."
