Senator Martins Serves as Guest Speaker

Due to rain showers and dark skies early on Memorial Day morning, the Williston Park

tribute to the veterans inside the post. The 55th Annual Post Everlasting Services paid
tribute to all those who served, departed members and those who went off to service and

sadly did not return.

Post commander Frank Oliveiri conducted the services. Reverend Christine van Liew of the Episcopal Church of the Resurrection gave the invocation and then former Town of North Hempstead Supervisor John Kiernan introduced guest speaker, Senator Jack M. Martins.

Senator Martins addressed the audience of veterans as well as members of the community and members of the Williston Park Fire Department. "We all think of Memorial Day as the start of summer when we gather with our friends and families for barbecues. It's all too easy to forget that we do have so many of our brothers and sisters who are serving around the world and in harm's way.
