July 4th has been a federal holiday in the United States since 1941, but the

tradition of Independence Day celebrations goes back to the 18th century and the American Revolution (1775-83). In June 1776, representatives of the 13 colonies then fighting in the revolutionary struggle weighed a resolution that would declare their independence from Great Britain. The first recorded use of the phrase 'Independence Day' was used in 1791. In 1820, the first Fourth of July celebration was held in Eastport, Maine.
