New York was home to Susan B. Anthony and Elizabeth Cady Stanton who in 1869 formed the National Woman Suffrage Association. The primary goal of that organization was to achieve voting rights for women. March is a great month to take time to celebrate the enormous contributions of great women from our past.

"Eleanor Roosevelt once said, 'At all times, day by day, we have to continue fighting for freedom of religion, freedom of speech, and freedom from want... from these are things that must -- gained in peace as well as in war'. "Society is much more equal today, but sexism, discrimination, and racism have not disappeared and hamper our progress as a nation. I encourage all New Yorkers to reflect on our history this month, rededicate ourselves to fairness and equality for all, and volunteer in a way that helps women in our community," Smith concluded.
