Additionally, Bill has spent his civilian life serving the community in various capacities within the Probation Department, serving as parole office and also as a law enforcement instructor.

Bill is a published author who recently penned <u>The Veteran in a New Field</u>, a Civil War mystery novel of the Irish Brigade set in Saugerties, NY at the Mountain House in 1866. He is currently working on his second novel.
